The celebration of Easter can fall anywhere between March 22 and April 25. This year's Easter is on the late end. *The Easter Sunday worship schedule:*

In preparation for Easter both churches will have worship. Beaver Creek will meet at 7:00 on Thursday, April 17 for Maundy Thursday worship. Communion will be served.

Holmes will have worship the next night, Good Friday, also at 7:00 pm. Communion will be served.

More Detail about How Easter Day is Determined:

Easter day is determined by the first Sunday after the first full Moon occurring on or after the spring or vernal equinox. This formula was established by the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD.

The vernal equinox is the time of year when the length of the day is equal to the length of the night. This usually happens around March 20 or March 21.

Thus, if the full Moon occurs on or after the spring equinox, Easter will be the first Sunday following the full Moon. If the full Moon falls on a Sunday, Easter falls on the following Sunday.

What I've Been Thinking Some Things are Important; Some are Eternal

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though he earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea ... " Psalm 46:1-2

Are any of you old enough to recognize these words from a popular song a few decades ago?

"Help! I need somebody
Help! Not just anybody
Help! You know I need someone.
Help."

That is, of course the Beatles from their "Help" album released in August of 1965. If you look more closely at more of the lyrics you would see the group admitted they once thought they "never needed anybody's help in any way." But now they've changed their mind.

This song was written by John Lennon and, according to some accounts, was composed during one of Lennon's bouts with depression.

Do you need any help? During the last few days — since I've had the knee surgery — I have been quite dependent, mostly upon Betty. At first I really couldn't get anything for myself and, even if I could she was there to make sure I didn't do too much. I needed help. I need help. And not just because of my knee.

This is one part of the basic human condition. We all need help at one time or another and we also ought to be giving some help when we can. Remember the words of Hebrews 13:16: "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased."

Receiving help is sometimes a challenge for us. We don't like to be dependent on others. But the Bible would tell us it is more blessed to give than receive so when we receive gratefully the help of others we give them a blessing.

Giving help can also be a challenge. We don't know what to do or for whom. Maybe we don't notice the needs some person has for a simple listening ear or for a helping hand. It's even possible that we question whether someone deserves help.

But maybe the biggest issue is our reluctance to see the help we need the most and that's *help from God*. See the verse at the top of this column, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." There are things I cannot do without God help. Forgive. Be Patient. Know what to do in difficult circumstances. Keep up my prayer life. Salvation. Live the Christian Life.

The Beatles, in this case, were right. We need help. We need help from others (just like they need it from us). And we need help from God for this life and into the next!


Marlon Lange had his extensive surgery on March 19. Though it was complex it went well. He is at the University of Minnesota.


If you have any questions you can run them past me. I'm moving pretty slow, but I'll get you an answer!


